

Holiday Service Impacts

Due to the Independence Day holiday, city administrative offices will be closed on **Friday, July 4**.

Emergency services will still be available during this time.

Solid waste and recycling collection will operate on a normal schedule.

Fireworks Prohibited in City of Tomball

The sale, display, storage, transport, or manufacture of fireworks is prohibited in the City Limits of Tomball. Fireworks are considered a public nuisance. The Fire Marshal's Office patrols throughout the City during New Year's and Independence Day celebrations looking for illegal fireworks. Violators found in possession of fireworks are subject to citations and forfeiture of fireworks.

Capital Project Update

The City of Tomball's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is a multi-year planning and budgeting tool that identifies and prioritizes major capital projects and infrastructure investments needed to maintain or improve public services and facilities. Projects in the CIP help improve the quality of life for residents and help reach the community's long-term vision of ensuring Tomball remains a great place to live, work, and visit. For 2025, we have several projects that have been recently completed or are currently in progress:

- North Star Drainage Improvements
- Rudolph Rd. Sanitary Sewer Extension
- Cherry St. Natural Gas Line Replacement


Ongoing:

- East Water Plant and South Wastewater Treatment Plant Expansion
- Oak & Clayton Water Line Installation

Proper Green Waste Disposal Practices

To help keep Tomball clean and waste collection efficient, please follow these guidelines for green waste disposal:

- **Self-Haul:** Harris County residents can dispose of green waste behind the Road and Bridge Maintenance Facility at Service Center Rd., Tomball, Tx. 77377 Monday through Saturday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. You can find more information regarding rules and regulations for disposal at bit.ly/hcp4wastedisposal.
- **Curbside:** Frontier Waste Solutions provides curbside collection of bulk and brush once a week on your second collection day with a 12-item limit. Both bagged yard waste and tree trimmings that are cut, tied, and bundled are accepted. Each individual item must be limited to 40-pounds or less. Visit tomballtx.gov/residentialgarbage for additional details.
- **City Collection Policy:** The City of Tomball does not provide regular green waste pickup. On occasion, with prior approval from City Management, the City may remove green waste after major storm events. Improperly placed green waste outside of Frontier's guidelines or unauthorized City collection periods may result in contact from Code Enforcement.

Following these rules keep Tomball tidy and allows us to keep waste collection fees as low as possible. Thank you for doing your part!
